
Evaluation is required for all NYSED 21st CCLC grants. These evaluations include many elements conducted throughout the year for both accountability and learning.

This 'local report' is designed to provide the results from the past year of programming in a way that will foster learning and growth for this 21st CCLC program. It is designed to be shared with the community.





How Many Students Attended?


A total of 341 students participated in at least 1 hour of program this year, 99 students met the state threshold to count as participants (15 + hours). This is over 100% of the target number of 81.




Percent of target number of students who attended 15+ hours of programming

The program far surpassed the intended number of students served and met all performance measures




The smaller size of the school allows staff to have a deep understanding of the students and their needs
